Words, poetry, images. A book as a narrative elicits visual images. Poetry often elicits emotions and visual images. Our physical world creates lasting images, impressions on our memory. Color, hues of color, brilliant color, muted color tell a story of a particular day, can help us recall a particular place, a particular image, a particular emotion or a feeling. Words in a story have the ability to guide us to an image in our imagination. Compiling those colors, those images, those words, those emotions, the places into an abstract visual image is a challenge of mine as a visual artist. I attempt to create an image that allows, that asks, that invites the viewer through color, line, and marks to wander and remember journeys of their own.
