The observance of a funeral to celebrate the decadent's life has also been taken from us due to non-gathering laws of Covid-19 in various countries. The opportunity to say a final goodbye has become something that we took for granted prior to the pandemic.

This representation of an antique coffin pillow reminds us that it has been over 100 years since such sacred acts were limited by a deadly plague. Death is all around us now but it has become something only to be feared and rarely celebrated.
