Artist Statement

My work describes relationship as a concept. Combining drawing, painting, and design techniques, I create explicitly structured paintings based on the interactive principles of contrast and unity. These compositions are improvised narratives; theoretical conversations between energy and matter that contemplate how different elements relate to one another, as well as the whole.

Simultaneously emotional and restrained, these works are largely composed of primary shapes and patterns that interact with a grid. To me, the grid represents the web of life. It is a playground where method intermingles with imagination. I'm fascinated by the associations that develop during this process and like to refer to my work as abstractometry or measured abstraction.

These paintings depict shallow space, but symbolize something deeper than surface meaning. Rather than being settled or conclusive, they are meditations on the correlations between human perceptions and the environments in which we live. In this reductive place, I find room for intricate inquiries about evolution, connectivity, and identity.

Biography

Christa Stephens grew up on the desert prairie of eastern New Mexico. After receiving a bachelor's degree in music, she pursued formal and non-formal studies in fine art and graphic design that ultimately led to a unique expression of these disciplines through her own visual language of geometric form and structure. Her vibrant, hard-edge abstractions draw upon the stark beauty of the high desert plains, and reflect her musical sensibilities of rhythm, dynamics, and tonality.

Working from her studio in Santa Fe, New Mexico, Christa engages in an investigative process of dismantling larger concepts into individual elements in order to see how the particles relate to one another. Then she reconfigures them into a new composition, using graphite or colored pencil to improvise relational patterns on a prepared substrate. Heavy body acrylic paint is custom mixed to create the bold, saturated color that is layered into this procedure multiple times, growing more intricate along the way. Sometimes, hand-painted collage papers and other media are added to the mix.

Christa has participated in juried exhibitions throughout the southwest since 2017 and received honors from the El Paso Art Association in El Paso, TX, the Lubbock Arts Alliance in Lubbock, TX, and the Taos Art Insurgency in Taos, NM. In 2020, she created and donated work benefitting the Santa Fe Dreamers Project, the Santa Fe Artists Medical Fund, and the Navajo Nation Covid-19 Relief Fund. Her work is included in private collections in the US and the UK.
